ODLAN's mission is to remove digital literacy and access barriers by working with service providers to establish digital strategies that address the challenges marginalized communities face when accessing online service provisions. Our goal is to empower service providers with the resources, tools, and knowledge to build digital strategies that use an intergenerational approach to remove access barriers to digital programs and related services. We look forward to continuing our growth as an organization and establishing our operations so we can better serve our network partners.

2021 Milestones

Our first year was filled with action-based initiatives driven by our dedicated volunteers and network partners.
