Welcome to the 8th edition of the ODLAN newsletter. We are excited to share our most recent updates and new initiatives with you. Thank you for being a part of the ODLAN community.

Before we get into ODLAN's updates, we would like to take a moment to address this past summer's weather conditions. Multiple days were labelled as the hottest in history and many of us were affected by the smoke from the wildfires raging across Canada. We know climate change is a product of colonial practices. We must look to Indigenous knowledges and leadership in our responses to climate change. Over the next few months, ODLAN will be reflecting on what further decolonizing practices we can implement so that we can better stand in solidarity with local Indigenous communities.

We also want to bring awareness to the digital divide that exists not only in queer spaces, but also in remote locations, and especially on Indigenous reserves.

Less than 43% of households on Indigenous reserves have access to high-speed internet.

We know online spaces of Indigenous resistance are often silenced or made invisible by harmful AI algorithms. ODLAN's core mission is to end the digital divide. We will not forget Indigenous folks in this work.

We encourage everyone to reflect on how they can better support Indigenous groups and communities where they live.

DIGITAL SAFETY STRATEGIES: MITIGATING AND PREVENTING QUEERPHOBIC ONLINE HATE

We are excited to announce that ODLAN has received funding from the Government of Canada's Community Services Recovery Fund for the project "Digital Safety Strategies: Mitigating and Preventing Queerphobic Online Hate." For this project, we will be building on our previous research on anti-2SLGBTQIA+ online hate to develop six publicly available modules that will support 2SLGBTQIA+ non-profit leaders in understanding anti-2SLGBTQIA+ online hate from an intersectional perspective. The modules will also support service providers with developing and implementing digital safety plans.

University of Waterloo Stabbing

On June 28th, multiple students and an instructor were stabbed in a gender studies class at the University of Waterloo. This incident is only one example of a broader rise in anti-2SLGBTQIA+ and anti-feminist attitudes in Canada. Both in-person and online, conversations surrounding queerness are becoming more heavily monitored, censored, and dangerous.

As an organization that is made up largely of gender studies students, we are incredibly disturbed by this news. Queer digital safety has never been more important.
