

Learning Through Action: Community-based Interventions for Anti-2SLGBTQIA+ Online Hate

Online hate against 2SLGBTQIA+ communities can lead to significant **psychological** and **physical harm**, impacting individuals and organizations on and offline.

To address this, we developed "Understanding and Addressing Online Hate
Targeting 2SLGBTQIA+ Organizations," a series of six free on-demand online training
modules to equip individuals and organizations with resources and information to
combat anti-2SLGBTQIA+ online hate effectively.

After completing the modules, viewers provided feedback via an online survey or virtual interview to evaluate the modules and guide future e-learning initiatives.

Summary of Findings

Strengths:

- Provided new information about anti-2SLGBTQIA+ online hate
- Presented strategies were helpful in addressing online hate
- Information was clearly explained
- Modules were well-organized and easy to follow

Areas for improvement:

- More perspectives from Black and Indigenous trans voices
- More visual elements and colour coding in the training materials

Recommendations:

- Include diverse perspectives, especially from marginalized 2SLGBTQIA+ groups
- Improve visual and interactive elements to boost engagement
- Regularly update training resources based on participant feedback

Key Takeaway:

Soliciting and incorporating community feedback, alongside continuously refining training materials, is essential for effectively addressing emerging issues.
